When I'm stressed, rather than saying "I love my job!", I instead say "I love film!". "



OPENING FILM **TEN YEARS THAILAND**

Four Thai filmmakers envisage their homeland a decade onwards in this second installment of the Ten Years project, following the first Hong Kongbased anthology in 2015. Aditya Assarat, Apichatpong Weerasethakul, Chulayarnnon Siriphol, and Wisit Sasanatieng each contribute a segment that taken together sound a warning about the current political climate in

Thailand. Since 2014, the country has been ruled by a military dictatorship that curbs dissent, public expression, as well as creativity and diversity of thought. A new form of nationalism is on the rise, one with rigid rules of state-sanctioned logic and action. Left unchecked, what will the decade ahead look like?



Investigating a routine complaint, several soldiers visit an art gallery as part of checks on exhibitions around town to ensure there are no images that may cause conflict and misunderstanding. Young and naive conscript Kaen has a romantic encounter with Ann, the gallery's cleaning girl, but does not have the courage to speak up.

A youth organisation is trained by the state to find and arrest citizens who diverge from the established norms. Offenders are brought to the Ministry of VHS, where they undergo correctional discipline by way of a special light treatment. Through this, the authorities maintain a peaceful society of permanently happy faces.



A young man leads an otherwise average life except for one difference: he is the sole human remaining in a world of cats that walk, dress, act, and talk the way people do. Some are even his friends. THAIDDHI

Thaiddhi has had a hand in a couple of pioneering milestones in the Burmese film industry. He was a cinematographer on Nargis – When Time Stopped Breathing (2010), the country's first feature-length documentary. In 2011, he and his wife Thu Thu Shein established the Wathann Film Festival, the first of its kind in Myanmar. He currently runs Third Floor Production, which he co-founded in 2013.



FRANCIS JOSEPH CRUZ

Francis is a film critic whose articles and reviews can be seen in the pages of The Philippine Star, Philippines Free Press, and Businessworld. He has also been part of the selection committee for various film festivals both locally and abroad, including Cinemalaya, Cinema One, Quezon City, Jogjakarta, and QCinema.



MARCUS MANH CUONG VU

Marcus is a film curator, producer, festival organiser, and journalist based in Vietnam. In 2010, he founded Yxine Film Fest (YxineFF), an annual online international short film festival aimed at discovering talented young filmmakers.



20 short films from Southeast Asia compete for the SeaShorts Award, Best Cinematography Award, and Best Sound Award. The short films are selected based on their individual approaches in filmmaking and unique portrayals of the themes that surround the region.

While truly important, filmic excellence is not the sole basis for the selection. The short films need to be relevant, to be representative of the moods, joys, anxieties and apprehensions of the region. The short films need to be imaginative, to be able to comprehend not just the peculiarities of the artist but to be able to relay through the work the influences of history, society and culture. The short films have to be daring, not just in terms of form and message, but in embracing the function of films as also pieces of entertainment and enjoyment. The short films do not just express, they also explore, inquisitively bringing to the fore questions about identity and direction in these very strange and unpredictable times.

FATIMAH ABU BAKAR

Fatimah Abu Bakar is an actor who has worked in film, television, and theatre for close to three decades. Owing to her experience, she has coached many of Malaysia's award-winning talent, including Ida Nerina, Erra Fazira, Maya Karin, Rosyam Nor, Remy Ishak, Farid Kamil, Sharimah Amani, and Tiara Jacquelina. In addition to her career in the arts, Fatimah was a journalist with the New Straits Times for 26 years before she left as an associate editor in 2005.

A history graduate from Leiden University, Gertjan Zuilhof served stints as a programmer at an arthouse cinema as well as a film critic before joining the Rotterdam International Film Festival team. This developed into a more than two-decades long career dedicated to Southeast Asian movies. He currently employs his programming talents at film festivals across the region of his expertise. In 2018, Gertjan presented "SEA of Sadness", the culmination of his curatorial experience, at the Taiwan International Documentary Festival and

the Asian Film Archive in Singapore the following year.









GARIN NUGROHO

Born in Jogjakarta, Garin Nugroho was a prominent member of the 1990s film generation in Indonesia and one of a few who were at the forefront of the liberation from New Order-era industry regulations. His early films, such as Cinta dalam Sepotong Roti (1991), Surat Untuk Bidadari (1994), and Bulan Tertusuk Ilalang (1995), secured his place as Indonesia's preeminent director to attract serious interest in the international film festival scene. His oeuvre encompasses 19 feature films, 30 docuseries, five documentaries, seven essay films, three short films, six live theatre productions, two dance productions, five books, and three art installations.

SHIREEN SENO

Shireen is an artist and filmmaker who has exhibited at various galleries locally and abroad. In 2012, her debut film Big Boy screened at the Rotterdam International Film Festival and named Best First Film at the Festival de Cine Lima Independiente the following year. Her next film project, Nervous Translation, was one of 15 projects of Venice Biennale College – Cinema, was a recipient of a Script & Project Development grant from the Hubert Bals Fund, and participated in IFP's No Borders International Co-Production Market.



S-EXPRESS 2019

S-Express is an annual presentation of short films from across Southeast Asia. It evolved from a collaboration between Yuni Hadi (Singapore), Chalida Uabumrungjit (Thailand), and Amir Muhammad (Malaysia) in 2001 as a means of exposing selected works of their respective countries to new audiences in the region. Today, the travelling exchange includes curated programmes from ten countries (Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam, and Malaysia).

Programmers







Some films can be very personal, and a normal audience might find it hard to understand. Some films can be very personal, to the point that the filmmaker will feel shy when showing it to people. As filmmakers, should we be concerned about the people who MAKE the film, or the people who WATCH the film? A film co in be sincere enough, but everything changes when the film

As the name implies, people won't know where, when, and what will be screened under this programme. Hidden Programme just like a love letter, secretly written and sent.




